St. Anthony and Sacred Heart Catholic Churches + Sunday March 6, 2022

One of the many treasures of the Church down through the centuries is the marking of time. From a Catholic perspective you do not really know how to feast when Easter comes until you have fasted during Lent. So let us enter into the holy season of Lent with an open heart to what our Lord wants to teach us. The 40 days of Lent remind us of the 40 days that lesus fasted in the wilderness.

We participate in Lent through our prayers, fasting (giving up food, sweets, television etc.) and alms giving (doing good for another). So as we approach Lent, let us consider how the Lord is calling us to keep the season holy so as to have the best ever Easter. Please consider some of the following opportunities to make this a good Lenten season.

• Confessions

Saturdays 3:00- 3:45 pm at St. Anthony's Sundays 7:30 - 7:50 am at Sacred Heart Tuesday 5:00pm at St. Anthony's Fridays 5:00 - 5:20 pm (before stations) at Sacred Heart

- Attend Mass during the week
- Stations of the Cross

Fridays at 5:30 pm at Sacred Heart and St. Anthony's

- Rice Bowls to help the poor world wide by Catholic Relief Services. Available at the vestibules of both churches.
- Food Pantry to help the poor locally.

Regulations for Lent and the Easter Triduum 1) Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

2) Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to **abstain from meat** on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 and all the Fridays of Lent. (That includes Good Friday) Once you reach

age 14 you are obligated to abstain from meat the rest of your life! - on Ash Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent!

3) Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to **fast** on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 and Good Friday, April 15, 2022.

4) On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

5) To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

Readings for the first Sunday of Lent: Deuteronomy 26: 4-10, Psalm 91: 1-2, 10-15, Romans 10: 8-13. Luke 4: 1-13

In today's epic Gospel scene, Jesus relives in His flesh the history of Israel. We've already seen that, like Israel, Jesus has passed through water and been called God's beloved Son (see Luke 3:22; Exodus 4:22). Now, as Israel was tested for forty years in the wilderness, Jesus is led into the desert to be tested for forty days and nights (see Exodus 15:25). He faces the temptations put to Israel: Hungry, He's tempted to grumble against God for food (see Exodus 16:1–13). As Israel quarreled at Massah, He's tempted to doubt God's care (see Exodus 17:1–6). When the Devil asks for His homage, He's tempted to do what Israel did in creating the golden calf (see Exodus 32). Jesus fights the Devil with the Word of God, three times quoting from Moses' lecture about the lessons Israel was supposed to learn from its wilderness wanderings (see Deuteronomy 8:3; 6:16, 12–15). Why do we read this story on the first Sunday of Lent? Because like the biblical sign of forty (see Genesis 7:12; Exodus 24:18; 34:28; 1 Kings 19:8; Jonah 3:4), the forty days of Lent are a time of trial and purification. Lent is to teach us what we hear over and over in today's readings. "Call upon me, and I will answer," the Lord promises in today's Psalm. Paul promises the same thing in today's Epistle (quoting Deuteronomy 30:14; Isaiah 28:16; Joel 2:32). This was Israel's experience, as Moses reminds his people in today's First Reading: "We cried to the Lord ... and He heard." But each of us is its is to terach use, should see in the Mass a memo-rial of our salvation, and "bow down in His presence," offering ourselves in thanksgiving for all He has given us.
