The Twelve days of Christmas

Aside from the fact that Epiphany—which comes twelve days after Christmas—used to mark the end of the Christmas
Season, the song "Twelve Days of Christmas" is not really any part of Catholic liturgy.

The song of that name actually derives from a time in England from 1558 to 1829 when it was illegal to be a Catholic, and so the song contains a hidden catechism of Catholic theology.

Grant that from this day forward, I may in all things seek Thy greater glory, and may enjoy that peace promised to men of good will.
